

Robins Class

This has been a very short term, but Robins have crammed lots of learning in. We are getting really speedy at saying our sounds and reading words. We are also super clever at using the sounds we know to write words. We made posters to help find missing animals because in our story there was a missing bear that needed to find its home. There are amazing buildings in our classroom and outside every day. Our garden centre has been very busy and we have been growing plants. Mrs Roberts has eaten a wide variety of things made out of sand too. She is always very full at the moment! To finish the term off we were all superstars on sports day running our races and joining in with the throwing and other activities. Mrs Roberts and Mrs Wood weren't the only ones who were tired at the end of the day!



Kingfishers Class



We have had a great half-term exploring Australian Aboriginal Art and creating wonderful pictures, using symbols and the indigenous Australian dot style.

It has been lovely weather and the children have really enjoyed exploring in the forest. We have been exploring uses of everyday materials. We looked at what materials are best, how well different materials bounce and can solid objects change shape.

This term, our focus in maths has been on *money* and *fractions*. The children have explored real-life money problems, practising how to add and subtract amounts, give change, and solve word problems involving coins and notes. They also developed a strong understanding of fractions, including how to recognise and find halves, quarters, and thirds of shapes and quantities. We have had great fun using practical activities and games to support our learning, and the progress made has been fantastic.

In English, we have been reading *Troll Swap* by Leigh Hodgkinson. The children have loved getting to know the quirky characters and have produced some *amazing descriptions*, imaginative *lists*, and a thoughtful *letter in role*. Their writing has been full of creativity and rich vocabulary – a joy to read!

Owls Class

Owls have been very busy this half term enjoying the good weather! They have had a great time learning to put together their clarinets and playing in the open air.



They have also created some amazing Roman pots which were quite tricky. They persevered and the pots are looking fantastic! This week, they will be painting them and adding some precious stones.



Eagles Class

This half-term, children in Eagles class have had a very busy few weeks. Our Year 6 children have now completed their SATs and they should all be proud of their efforts. We also commemorated VE day by creating a class poppy wreath. Children wrote a prayer or a message of gratitude on their individual poppy and then all of our poppies joined together on our class wreath. In English, children wrote their own journalistic report based on Charles Darwin's journey to the Galapagos Islands.



Across the school, we also had our amazing sports day! It was the closest results we have ever had with Scotland winning by 1 single point. The competitive spirit of some of our parents came shining through for our egg and spoon race and we ended up with 3 heats before finally ending with last year's reigning champion bringing home the golden egg once more, congratulations Mr Deputy!

As a family you may want to talk about:


- why it is important to have rules and laws

Lady Justice

Lady **Justice** is one of the most famous landmarks in London. It is a bronze statue that stands on the domed roof of the Old Bailey. This building houses the central criminal courts where people who are accused of breaking

the law are tried by a judge and jury to find out if they are 'guilty' and should be punished or 'not guilty' and can go free.

Lady **justice** was designed to be a symbol of **justice**: in her left hand she carries the scales of truth and fairness and in her right hand a double edged sword representing the power of reason and **justice**.

FASCINATING FACTS

The World Village

If the world was a village, with 100 people living in it:

- 61 people would come from Asia,
 13 from Africa, 13 from the Americas,
 12 from Europe and 1 from Australasia
- 27 of the people would be under 15 and just 7 of them over 64
- half of the people would speak one of just 8
 languages and the most common language would be Chinese
- . 63 village people would not have running water in their homes






Bake Sale – Monthly
